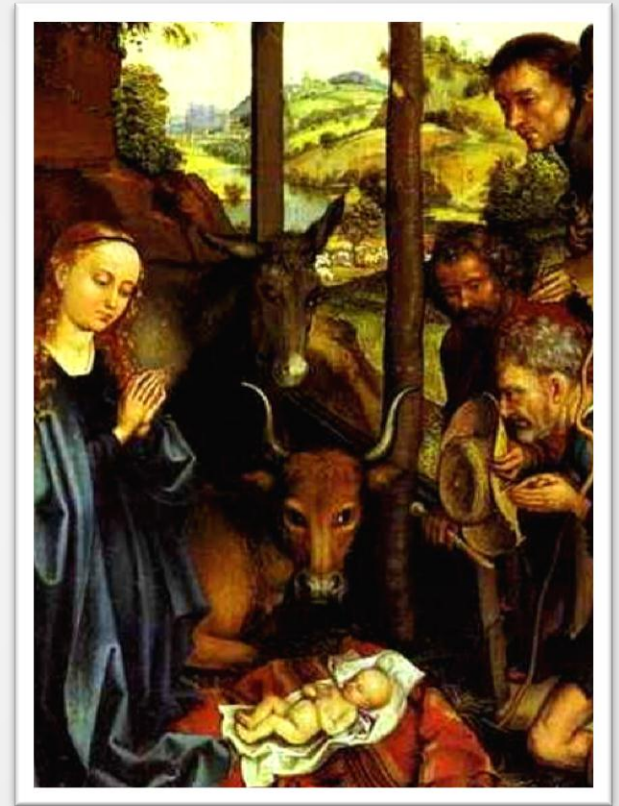

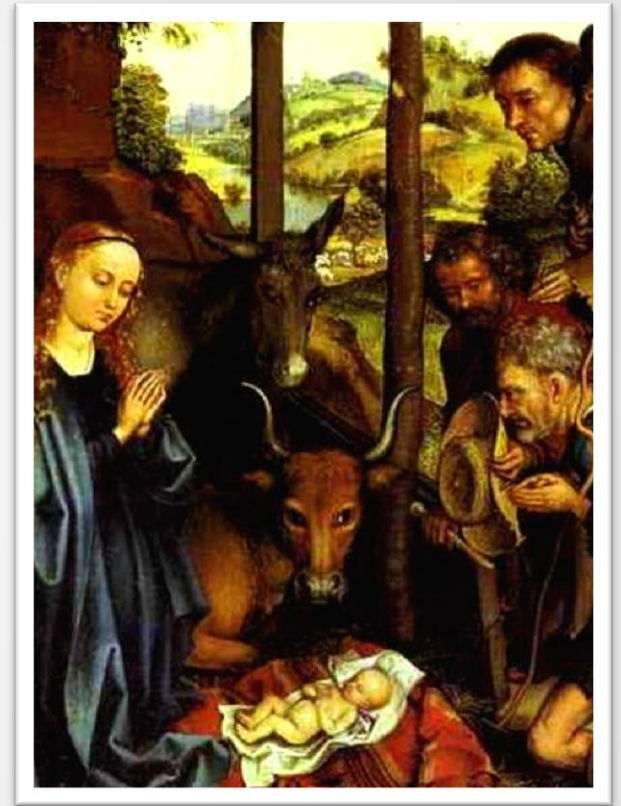
Comparing Nativities

- How does each Gospel's birth and infancy narrative reflect the particular themes and interests of each Gospel writer?



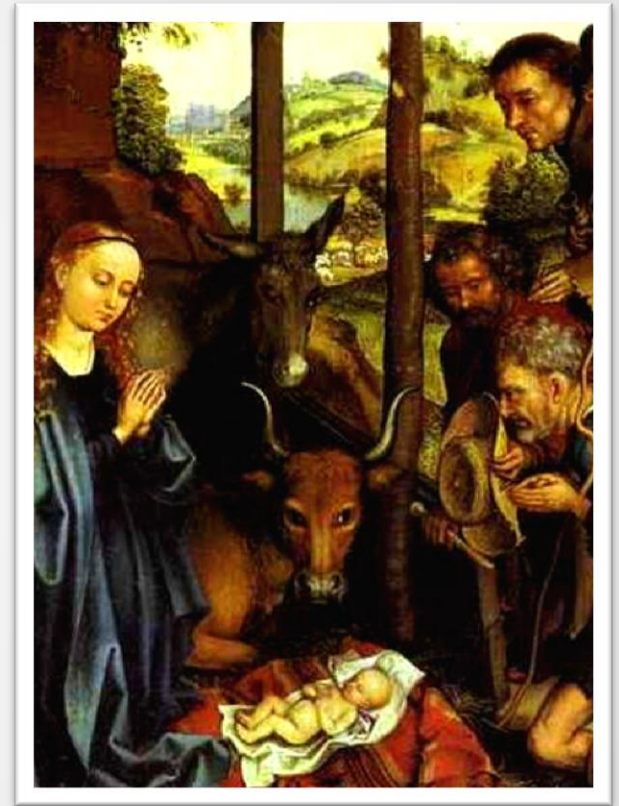
