Position Summary:

A Commuter Representative Volunteer (Commuter Rep) are there to help commuters integrate into the Tyndale community. Through good communication, being a campus resource, providing opportunities, as well as being a liaison to Student Development on behalf of the commuters. To model and uphold the standards set in the Tyndale Student Handbook, and to strive for excellence in their academics.

The Commuter Rep is responsible to commuters and Student Development.

Appointment Responsibilities:

- Assist with facilitating commuter focused activities during Orientation Week
- Communication with Commuters
 - Respond to commuter questions about upcoming events
 - Post commuter event information on the Commuter FB page and in the commuter lounge
 - Post information and announcements on the Commuter FB page
- Meet with the Community Life Senior Manager at least once a semester
 - Provide new ideas to help commuters feel welcome and connected
- Meet with TUUSA President at 1-2 times a semester
 - Connect with different members to find out what's going on around campus
 - Report to the TUUSA President about any comments or concerns from commuters that the council can address
- Provide hospitality for commuter in the commuter lounge
 - Set up and take down weekly coffee for commuters
 - Schedule time to be in the commuter lounge at least once during the week
- Connecting with first year commuters within the first month
- Encourage commuters to participate in the community; attending events, joining intramural teams, sticking around campus before & after class, etc.
- Reach out to commuters that live outside the 20 min. commute range
- Help connect commuters with other commuters and residents

Qualifications

- A cumulative GPA of 2.30. If the student's cumulative GPA is less than 2.3 then the student must have a current GPA of 2.7.
- Good financial standing with Tyndale
- Good standing with chapel attendance.
- At the point of application, have been a commuter for at least one prior semester.
- Able to be on campus for Orientation Monday, which is Labour Day Monday on September 7, 2020.
- Be a good role model for students.
- Commitment to Tyndale's mission and vision.
- Organization is beneficial.
- Professing Christian with demonstrated spiritual maturity.
- Take initiative, think creatively.
- Uphold, adhere, and model to the guidelines and rules set out in the Student Handbook.
