



## House Leader (HL)

**Department:** Department of Student Development

**Supervisor:** Director of Organizations

**Time Commitment:** August 30, 2020 till April 25, 2021

### Position Summary:

The House Leader is a member of the TUCSA Council. As a student leader they are responsible to promote the vision and mission of the Council, represent the students, strive for excellence in their academics, and to model the standards set in the Tyndale Student Handbook.

The HL's primary responsibility is to provide leadership, community development, and spiritual formational opportunities for their designated House (Adrian, Boehmer, Harris, McRae, and Stiller). They are also responsible for actively seeking out the concerns and ideas of the students within their house and to bring them to the council to discuss.

The House Leader is responsible to the student body, the TUUSA Council, the Director of Organizations, and Student Development.

### Student Leadership Responsibilities:

- Attend spring, fall, winter, and spring student leadership training sessions
- Attend Mental Health First Aid training, which is a part of spring training.
- Attend fall and winter student leadership getaway.
- Attend monthly student leadership workshop, run by Student Development.
- Meet once a semester with the Community Life Senior Manager.
- Assist with facilitating different activities during Orientation Week

### Appointment Responsibilities:

- Meet weekly with House Leader Team, run by Student Development.
- Meet in pairs with the Director of Organizations 1-2 times a semester.
- Attend TUUSA Council meetings (2 a semester)
- Provide overall leadership to your House.
  - Offer support and vision to your House
  - Provide opportunities for building community
    - Facilitate weekly House Lunches after Thursday chapels.
    - Lead bi-weekly small group Bible study (during Thursday Chapel time, alternating Thursdays)
    - Mentor 3-4 first year students
    - Promoting and help facilitate House Challenges (2-3 a semester).
    - One Gathering a semester (an event that promotes opportunities for building community (worship night, bowling, games night, spa night, etc.)
  - Offer support (devotional, emotional, academic (as appropriate), and relational) to members of the house.
- Help with set up and take down with 2-3 EC run events in the academic year.
- Help with set up or take down of the end of Fall semester event and Spring Banquet.

## Qualifications

- A cumulative GPA of 2.30. If the student's cumulative GPA is less than 2.3 then the student must have a current GPA of 2.7.
- Good financial standing with Tyndale
- Good standing with chapel attendance.
- Able to return to campus before fall and winter semesters start for training and/or retreats
- Able to take initiative, think creatively.
- Be a good role model for students.
- Commitment to Tyndale's mission and vision.
- Desire for personal growth
- Organization is beneficial.
- Professing Christian with demonstrated spiritual maturity.
- Uphold, adhere, and model to the guidelines and rules set out in the Student Handbook.
- Conflict resolution is beneficial
- Leadership experience is beneficial.
- If a student leader desires to take more than 15 credit hours they need to consult with the Community Life Senior Manager on the work load that would have on balancing academics and their leadership responsibilities.
- If a student leader desires to have an additional job they need to talk with the Community Life Senior Manager on how they can balance their work load as a student, their leadership responsibilities, and this additional responsibility.
