I. COURSE DESCRIPTION

A study of the message of the Gospel of John in light of its historical, literary, and theological contexts. Special emphasis will be given to John's argument, and key topics such as Christology, faith, life, and Holy Spirit.

Prerequisites : none.

- 1. Gain a fuller understanding of the message Gospel of John in light of its historical, literary, and theological settings.
- 2. Be able to critically examine and evaluate commentaries on John by comparing and contrasting their goals and methods of New Testament exegesis.
- 3. Be able to articulate significant features of a major Johannine theological theme and reflect on their contemporary relevance.
- 4. Become more informed and thoughtful in his/her understanding of the message and relevance of John's Gospel, and be more passionate in pursuing a deeper, life-long relationship with the Lord.

D. ASSIGNMENTS AND GRADING

- 1. Class Discussion on Assigned Readings (30%). Students are required to read before each class the assigned section of John (see Course Schedule) and the relevant section of the commentary by either Carson OR Chong. They are expected to participate in the discussion on the Scriptural text and the commentary.
- 2. Critical Questions (30%). Students are expected to submit in writing 5 to 10 critical questions in relevant to John or the commentary that they read. These questions should reflect in depth thinking on the subject matter and enhance the understanding of John. The Instructor will answer these questions in class.
- **3.** Final Paper (40%). The paper should be a substantial piece of analysis in response to a key event/person/passage/theological concept in John. It should not simply report, summarize, or review class materials, but concentrate upon the significance of such subject matter in John and its contribution to the New Testament in general. It should demonstrate thoughtful reflection, analysis, and should embody a conceptual argument in which various angles of the questions are explored in fairness and at length. Length: approx. 5,000 words. Due on Fri, Jun 4, 2021 (three weeks after the last class).

E. EQUITY OF ACCESS
