WE ACKNOWLEDGE

"For thousands of years the Greater Toronto Area has been the traditional land of the Huron-Wendat, the Seneca and, most recently, the Mississaugas of the Credit River. It is part of the 'Dish With One Spoon Territory,' a treaty between the Anishinaabe, Mississaugas and Haudenosaunee that committed them together to share the territory and protect the land. Other Indigenous Peoples and Nations have subsequently entered this territory in the spirit of peace, friendship and respect. It is on these lands, and in this spirit, that Tyndale seeks to engage in its work."

This land acknowledgment was developed specifically for Tyndale University in 2018, under the guidance of Elder Dr. Terry LeBlanc and in consultation with individuals from the Six Nations and the urban Indigenous community of the Greater Toronto Area.

UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE & CERTIFICATE OPTIONS

BACHELOR OF ARTS (BA)

The Bachelor of Arts degree focuses on subjects within the liberal arts, humanities, social sciences, languages, culture and fine arts. Gain a broadly-based liberal arts education. The main goal of this degree is to help you integrate Christian faith and a broad understanding of our culture into a comprehensive Christian worldview.

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA)

The BBA degree opens up career options in the public, private and nonprofit sectors. Expect to gain valuable leadership and management skills along with an in-depth understanding of business principles and practices. Discover how to combine Christian ethics with business acumen to make positive economic, social, spiritual and environmental impacts on the world.

DEGREE COMPLETION PROGRAMS

The Degree Completion Program (DCP) is a non-traditional program specifically designed for adults (25 years+) who want to complete a Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Religious Education (BRE) degree but who are unable to attend traditional semester programs. Students with initial transfer credit can be enrolled into the Degree Completion Program.

FIVE-YEAR BA + MDIV DUAL DEGREE

The BA + MDiv Dual Degree is Canada's first, blending liberal arts and theological education. Earn a BA in Biblical Studies and Theology and a Master of Divinity in just five years. This accelerated program equips you for ministry sooner, offering a comprehensive foundation in theology and practical training for various ministry contexts.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (2+2)

The BSc 2+2 programs are academic pathways where you spend two years at Tyndale before transferring to another four-year university to complete your bachelor's degree. You will complete a series of first- and second-year science-related courses, along with a portion of Tyndale's Core courses. You will then enter year three of Redeemer's four-year BSc programs to complete your chosen degree.

CERTIFICATES

Explore possibilities for further study while deepening your relationship with Christ. Certificates can be completed in one year (two semesters) and will introduce you to topics in Christian Studies as well as other disciplines such as Philosophy, History or Psychology. Certificate programs may be taken full-time or part-time and courses may be transferred into a BA or BRE degree program.

BACHELOR OF ARTS

Tyndale's Bachelor of Arts (BA) program focuses on subjects within the liberal arts, including humanities, social sciences, languages, culture and media arts. The degree allows students to gain a broad liberal arts education and an understanding of culture through a Christian worldview.

Biblical Studies and Theology: Stretch and grow both academically and spiritually, all within a supportive community. Actively pursue the hard questions of the Bible, theology and life as you are challenged by professors and peers from different backgrounds.

Business: Whether you are looking to lead a business team, run a not-for profit organization, be an entrepreneur or incorporate social justice with business, the Tyndale BA in Business will teach you the practical skills employers look for. Enter the workplace fully prepared to generate cutting-edge solutions for the complex business problems of today and tomorrow. You will gain a solid foundation by studying finance, sales and marketing, human resources, accounting, operations, entrepreneurship and Christian social enterprise.

English: Be challenged to think critically as you study a broad range of genres, from Canadian poetry to African American fiction, and authors from John Milton to Jane Austen. Learn to make connections between classical literature and faith-based concepts. Professors will teach you to write persuasively, frame a compelling narrative, and analyze levels of meaning in texts. You will also have the opportunity to build your portfolio as you publish or perform your own work.

Early Childhood Education: Be prepared to make a difference in the lives of children for a brighter future. Earn both a college diploma and a university degree in just four years of full-time study through Tyndale's partnership with Seneca College. Develop a solid understanding of cognitive development, social and emotional development theories, and the physical development of children from birth to six years old.

Social Service Work: Learn to make a lasting impact in the lives of individuals and communities who need positive change. Through a partnership with Seneca College, you will earn both a college diploma and a university degree in four years. The combination of your degree and diploma will give you both the theoretical foundation and practical knowledge that employers are looking for. Apply your classroom learning to real-life situations so you can help clients overcome personal obstacles in this meaningful career.

History and Global Studies: Learn to think critically and write persuasively about the political theories, social patterns and cultural traditions of the past so that you can make a difference for the future. Faculty members will prepare you to make connections and communicate your own thoughts effectively so that you can be successful in graduate and professional school and/or in your career.

Linguistics: Deepen your understanding of different cultures, facilitate mother-tongue literacy and open the doors of opportunity to speakers of minority languages. You will study aspects of language such as phonetics, syntax and semantics and learn how to use these tools to provide practical research and services to benefit minority language speakers worldwide. Prepare for a future career that can take you anywhere in the world.

Media Arts - Business: Learn how media can be an advocate for business, and create marketing campaigns and content on your own. Like any business, research skills, and project management are important for getting media projects both started and finished. Knowledge and experience in these fields is gained both in the classroom and through personal and group projects.

Media Arts - Fine Arts: Courses in Animation, Motion Graphics and VFX Storytelling, and The History and Practice of Experimental Media takes you through a variety of different techniques and approaches to creating animations, graphics, film and media. Explore various approaches to media art and even push new boundaries of your own.

Media Arts - Media Ministry: By studying Bible stories that express God's relationship with Creation, you will learn the literary forms of biblical traditions, as well adapting them to your own creative allegorical works. While exploring how media influences modern culture, you will have the opportunity to creatively "make" theology through media. You will assess Christian themes and meaning behind films, comparing aesthetic approaches and their effectiveness as "apologetic art that reveals truth."

Media Arts - Production: Gain a wide variety of practical skills and theoretical knowledge over your four years in class and in the field. While learning the nuts and bolts of Dramatic Filmmaking, Social Media Production and Documentary Filmmaking, you will be given the opportunity to create projects that express unique messages related to your own interests. A survey course like The Practice of Film Theory puts knowledge into practice with weekly hands-on media projects.

Music - Performance: Gain the skills and techniques needed to launch your career as a solo performer, music teacher and recording artist with confidence to creatively influence the music performance field locally and globally. You can choose from three concentrations: voice performance, piano performance and guitar performance. Tyndale provides a supportive community where musicians can learn from expert practitioners as they explore their gifting and refine their craft.

Music - Worship Arts: Serving both the church and society, this program equips students musically, biblically and practically to lead worship with self-assurance and theological awareness. With a diverse faculty of professional musicians, students receive world-class music education through leading-edge courses, internships, individual and group training, mentorship, as well as performance and ministry opportunities.

Philosophy: Learn to think critically about important life questions as you explore worldviews and grow in your knowledge and faith. Develop critical reasoning skills that will prepare you for graduate and law school and a broad range of careers.

Psychology: Build a solid foundation in core areas, including behavioural, cognitive, personality, abnormal and social psychology. Faculty will support you in tailoring your studies to your interests and career goals. You can be part of an important field that seeks to predict, treat and interrupt mental illness, abusive behaviour or addiction. Study in one of the few undergraduate programs in Canada that give you not only research opportunities, but practicum experiences as well.

BA CONCENTRATIONS

Bible Translation: Build upon a BA in Linguistics, preparing you to pursue Bible translation as a vocation.

Christian Apologetics: This concentration within the BA in Philosophy will help you better understand, articulate and defend your faith.

Law: Building upon your Philosophy major, the Law concentration is designed to equip you with the skills and knowledge necessary to navigate complex ethical and legal issues in today's society from a Christian perspective.

Writing and Communication: This concentration within the BA in English provides an opportunity to practise written, verbal and visual modes of expression.

DEGREE COMPLETION PROGRAM PSYCHOLOGY (BA)

The Degree Completion Program (DCP) in Psychology is a non-traditional program specifically designed for adults who want to complete a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree in Psychology but who are unable to attend traditional semester programs. Students who transfer 30-42 credit hours into the program can complete the degree within 3 years if they complete 10 courses per year, or within 4 years if they complete 8 courses per year.

Tyndale's Psychology program will prepare you to make a difference by giving you a solid foundation in core areas, including behavioural, cognitive, personality, abnormal and social psychology. Faculty will support you in tailoring your studies to your interests and career goals. You can be part of an important field that seeks to predict, treat and even interrupt mental illness, abusive behaviour or addiction.

Study in one of the few undergraduate programs in Canada that gives you not only research opportunities, but practicum experiences as well. Examples include working with special needs students or with youth at mental health centres. You will have the option to conduct your own research as an honours student and the opportunity to present your work to both peer and expert audiences.

DEGREE COMPLETION PROGRAM BACHELOR OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (BRE)

This three-year degree is designed to prepare students for ministry in the local church, para-church organizations or missions. This is an excellent degree for those already in ministry or for those planning to become involved in ministry. Discover how to integrate faith, learning and everyday life in a meaningful and practical way as you study the Bible and explore how to become more effective in ministry and in the workplace.

Pastoral Ministry: Do you believe God is leading you to pursue a pastoral role? Gain the practical tools needed to serve in church ministry and develop a deeper Christian character to minister to others. Explore ministry as your career calling through a practical internship that will give you a clearer understanding of what it really means to be a pastor. Professors who are currently serving as pastors will pour into you and help prepare you for a life of ministry. Be equipped to respond effectively to real-life challenges that can arise in today's ministries so that you can make a difference in the future.

Youth Ministry: Are you passionate about helping youth navigate through tough issues and grow in their faith? Prepare to lead and disciple youth through practical training and experience. Participate in an internship, where you will help youth overcome obstacles and deepen their walk with God. Develop a solid understanding of what it looks like to work in various contexts of youth ministry and become more comfortable with preaching and youth culture through courses with supportive faculty.

Tyndale also offers the Bachelor of Religious Education (BRE) degree with a focus in General Ministries in a modular format, a recognized undergraduate degree fully approved by the Province of Ontario. Study full-time while continuing to fulfil other life commitments.

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA)

The Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) degree opens career options in the public, private and non-profit sectors. Students can expect to gain valuable leadership and management skills along with an in-depth understanding of business principles and practices. Faculty will help students solidify and meet their goals, and business professionals will provide networking opportunities and guidance along the way. Discover how to combine Christian ethics with business acumen to make positive economic, social, spiritual and environmental impacts on the world.

What Sets Our Program Apart

Mindset: We are committed to the redemptive PURPOSE of the marketplace mission, with Jesus at its core. We are pioneers in integrating the redemptive framework into our business curriculum and are oriented towards reclaiming our society and culture to advance the kingdom of God.

Transformation: We prioritize redemptive PRACTICE. Our courses are thoughtfully designed to impart essential knowledge in an action-oriented hands-on learning environment to develop critical skills.

BA BSTH + MDIV DUAL DEGREE

The five-year BA + MDiv Dual Degree at Tyndale University is the first of its kind in Canada, combining Tyndale's liberal arts and theological education. By enrolling in this pathway, you will earn both a Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Biblical Studies and Theology (BSTH) and a Master of Divinity (MDiv) in just five years of full-time study, instead of the traditional seven. This accelerated pathway provides a comprehensive education in theology and ministry, preparing you to serve effectively in various ministry contexts sooner.

Program Structure:

- Years 1-3: Focus on BA courses
- Year 4: Combination of BA and MDiv course
- Year 5: Complete remaining MDiv courses

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (BSC) 2+2 PARTNERSHIP

2+2 programs are academic pathways where students spend two years at Tyndale before transferring to another four-year university to complete their bachelor's degree. Students will complete a series of first- and second-year science-related courses, along with a portion of Tyndale's Core courses. They will then enter year three of Redeemer University's four-year BSc programs to complete their chosen degree.

Biology: Explore the complexity, diversity, and intricacies of living organisms, that include everything from molecules to human bodies to ecosystems. Enhance your wonder for the natural world by exploring deeper into the intricacies of God's creation, gaining a better insight into the Creator. The Biology program equips you to be knowledgeable and an active participant to the field, with a firm foundation in stewardship for nurturing and preserving creation.

Health Sciences Professional with a Minor in Psychology: Explore the scientific side of health sciences and learn about how spiritual, psychological, environmental, and social factors influence human health and well-being. Cultivate a solid biblical understanding of health and well-being. Gain a solid foundation for various health-related professions. Understand the variables that influence human health to demonstrate Christian compassion, integrity, and respect to individuals facing illness, disability, chronic conditions, or mental health challenges.

Health Sciences Pre Medicine With a Minor in Chemistry: The way we think about health and sickness has been influenced by the ideas and beliefs from philosophy and religion that have shaped Western culture over time. The program will help you in developing a biblical perspective on health, wellness, illness, and medical ethics. Alongside thorough exploration of fundamental themes, gain practical skills to excel in the MCAT exam and prepare for medical school applications.

CERTIFICATE IN CHRISTIAN STUDIES

The Certificate in Christian Studies can be completed in one year (two semesters) and will introduce students to the principles of Christian discipleship and spiritual formation, the history of Christianity, and other disciplines such as Philosophy, History or Psychology. This program is designed to ease the transition from high school to university and is also a good option for those who are returning to undergraduate studies after time away.

Through the Certificate in Christian Studies, you will learn:

- A basic biblical foundation and an introduction to the history of Christianity.
- An introduction to principles of Christian discipleship and spiritual formation.
- How to express yourself well through the written word and become familiar with important works of English literature.
- Practical ministry experience.

Certificate in Christian Studies - Pentecostal

The Certificate in Christian Studies - Pentecostal is a one-year certificate program that may be taken full-time or part-time. It is a good option for those who are unsure as to whether they wish to complete a four-year degree in Biblical Studies and Theology - Pentecostal. It provides students with introductory theological training and ministry preparation, and can be transferred to the four-year program if desired.

MINORS

Children's Ministry: Want to positively shape the next generation? Develop the skills and experience to work in children's ministry. Professors with a passion for serving children will teach you practical tools and theory to understand children and their relationship with God. You will develop a solid understanding of children's characteristics and needs at each stage of their development.

Intercultural Studies: Develop skills to minister to diverse groups in various cultural contexts. Learn how to communicate across cultures and connect with people of various backgrounds. Complete a cross-cultural ministry internship and see how you can join in God's work.

Christian Apologetics: You will develop the intellectual skills to love God with your mind, while being equipped to engage in apologetics ministries in the workplace, on the web, in the local church and on college/university campuses.

Ethics and Law: Explore a range of topics related to ethics and law, including Canadian Business Law, Critical Reasoning, Symbolic Logic, Business Ethics, Ethics of War and more. These courses will provide you with a solid foundation in legal principles, critical thinking, and ethical reasoning, while also exploring the intersection of faith and the law.

Music and Worship Arts: This minor combines musicianship and performance studies with the theology and history of sacred music. Develop a solid basis musically, biblically and practically to lead in worship music with self-assurance and theological awareness.

Sociology: The Minor in Sociology offers you an enriching opportunity to explore the dynamics of human interaction, social structures, and cultural systems. This minor program provides a comprehensive foundation in sociological theory, research methods, and critical analysis, allowing you to develop a deeper understanding of society and its complexities.

THE HOUSE SYSTEM

HOME SWEET HOME

Stepping foot on campus for the first time can be a bit daunting — especially when trying to find your class quickly among new faces.

Tyndale's House system offers opportunities to connect with people from various programs to avoid that "lost-in-a-crowd" feeling. You are not just a number to us. We strive to build community and help you connect.

HOW IT WORKS

New students are assigned to one of five Houses, which remains the student's House throughout their years at Tyndale and as an alum. Each House is named after one of our past presidents who had a significant impact on Tyndale during their time in office.

Each house has two House Leaders who facilitate activities and gatherings. Beyond fostering friendships, members help collect points through friendly competition. The House with the most points at the end of the second semester wins!

Through the House system, first-year students can connect with students from higher years who they may otherwise never meet, all while participating in sports and events. We have seen some wonderful mentoring relationships happen through the Houses, and it can be a great encouragement to new students.

COMPETE



BACHELOR OF EDUCATION

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WHY PURSUE TEACHING AT TYNDALE?

Teachers make a difference in the lives of their students. They interact with learners every day, and can significantly motivate them to grow through self-knowledge, skills development and citizenship. Tyndale's BEd program will prepare you well for this rewarding career.

1. FAST TRACK YOUR CAREER

Tyndale's BEd program is four semesters over 16 consecutive months. Beginning in August and ending in November of the following year, the program is intense and thorough, and there is no faster route to becoming an Ontario-certified educator in the Greater Toronto Area.

2. BROADEN YOUR SKILL SET

Designed with a strong conceptual framework, the Tyndale program prepares educators to adapt to the needs of learners with various abilities. The faculty at Tyndale are experienced, Ontario-certified educators who will empower you to differentiate, and to create effective and equitable learning environments through modeling and through a variety of instructional strategies.

3. RECEIVE ONE-ON-ONE SUPPORT

Your assigned faculty advisor will provide mentorship and guidance throughout the 16 months of the program. They will visit your practicum placement school multiple times, and provide all the support and encouragement you need to integrate the theory learned in courses with the practicalities of the classroom.

4. EXPERIENCE FAITH-BASED LEARNING

Tyndale's teacher candidates are people of different backgrounds and faiths, including some who do not identify with any faith tradition. What you believe and value impacts who you are as an educator. Every course you take at Tyndale will provide an opportunity to consider your personal beliefs—beliefs about students, learning, faith, and morals. You will reflect on how your beliefs shape who you are in the classroom, and how you can positively impact learners of different abilities, socio-economic status, race, language, faith, culture, gender, and sexual orientation.

5. BUILD KNOWLEDGE ABOUT INDIGENOUS PEOPLES, PERSPECTIVES AND EXPERIENCES – PAST AND PRESENT

As part of addressing the calls to action for educators in Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Report, Tyndale maintains relationships with several Indigenous community members. Indigenous scholars will also visit almost every course you take at Tyndale, providing an integrated approach to address particular course content from an Indigenous perspective, and to help you develop an understanding of your own personal role in fostering peace and reconciliation.

6. PRACTICUM OPTIONS

Complete your first two practicum placements in your choice of nine public and Catholic school boards in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area. For your third practicum, choose to remain within the school board of your choice, or:

- Apply to complete Practicum 3 in a private, alternative, French language, or faith-based school.
- Apply to the Northern Placement Option, and complete three weeks of your teaching block in a First Nations community in northern Ontario.

7. ENJOY A PROGRAM THAT HIGHLY VALUES THE ARTS

Many of Tyndale's BEd faculty are educated in the arts and incorporate music, drama, dance, and visual art across all curricular areas. Whether you consider yourself an artistic person or not, you will experience a brave, creative space; develop transferable skills; and maximize opportunities for student engagement and identity development through the arts.

8. FLOURISH IN A SUPPORTIVE, CLOSE-KNIT COMMUNITY

Between classes on Tyndale's campus, spend time in the community kitchen, where you can enjoy free coffee. During breaks, eat lunch with peers, work on group projects, and connect with professors. Faculty offices are right beside the classrooms, so you can easily stop in to chat or ask questions. Over the Tuesday lunch breaks you might choose to attend Tyndale's chapel service. Or in good weather, you may want to spend your breaks outside, pick up one of the BEd department's picnic quilts, and head outside to sit under the trees or near the ravine.

Demonstrate the knowledge and skills of Ontario's curricular areas in either the Primary and Junior or the Junior and Intermediate divisions, linking theory and practice through the design and delivery of units and lessons that incorporate clear learning goals, differentiated tasks, assessment, and evaluation.
3. Engage the diversity of learners in today's classrooms through utilizing the framework of differentiated instruction, developing awareness of culturally relevant and responsive pedagogy and special learning needs, as well as gaining competency in the use of assistive technologies.
4. Recognize and honour the rich cultural heritage and knowledge systems of Indigenous people, and foster learning environments that actively promote reconciliation and understanding.
5. Cultivate engaging, inclusive, brave, and equitable learning environments that nurture students' intellectual, emotional, social, physical, and spiritual well-being.
6. Explain how their beliefs, values, positionality, and knowledge directly influence professional practice.

PROGRAM INFORMATION



You will have the opportunity to focus on one of three programs:

1. Primary/Junior: This program prepares you to teach from Kindergarten - Grade 6.
2. Primary/Junior French as a Second Language (FSL): This program prepares you to teach from Kindergarten - Grade 6 with a focus on French as a Second Language.
3. Junior/Intermediate: This program prepares you to teach Grades 4 to 10. As a Junior/Intermediate candidate you require an academic background in a subject specialty (teachable).

The teachable areas available to you at Tyndale are:

- English
- Geography
- Mathematics
- Science - General
- French
- History
- Music (Instrumental)

PRACTICUM

At Tyndale, you will complete approximately 10 practicum days, which involve classroom observation, participation, and practice teaching. These practicum days are strategically interspersed throughout the program, in order to strengthen the theory-practice interconnections that link courses and practical application. Observe and learn from in-service teachers, and build your understanding of the Ontario education system, as you are immersed in the teaching profession.

The practicum experience at Tyndale is unique. Because the program begins in August, experience the first month of the school year in your placement schools twice – once in the first year of the program, and again in the second. In the first year, observe how an Ontario-certified teacher designs their classroom community in the first month of school. The following year, you will participate more actively in this process, based on your learning from Tyndale classes and your two previous practicum placements, as you join your host teacher for the first week of school.

PROGRAM FORMAT

This schedule is a general overview only and is subject to change from year to year. Once teacher candidates are registered in the program, they receive a detailed schedule that includes exact dates and takes priority over the following timelines and descriptions.

SEMESTER ONE (Aug - Nov)

August will be spent in classes on the Tyndale Campus three days per week – Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. In September, you will experience the first week of school as you begin the Observation/Participation phase of your first practicum. From September until November, your time will be divided between classes on campus for two to three days per week, and one day per week in your practicum school.

SEMESTER TWO (Dec - Apr)

Semester Two includes the continuation of your first practicum with three full-time weeks of five days per week of Practice Teaching in your practicum school. In January, you will begin your second practicum with a week of Observation/Participation. From mid-January through April, your time will be divided between classes on campus two to three days per week (4 days for PJ FSL).

SEMESTER THREE (May - July)

Continue your second practicum with five weeks of full-time Practice Teaching in your practicum school. During June and July, you will focus on classes three or four days per week at the Tyndale campus.

SEMESTER FOUR (Aug - Nov)

Spend three days per week in Tyndale classes, for approximately four weeks. September begins with five days of Observation/Participation in your third practicum. During the rest of September, you will spend up to three days per week in Tyndale classes, and two days per week in your practicum school. In October, you will experience another full week of Observation/Participation time, followed immediately by five weeks of full-time Practice Teaching in your practicum school. The remainder of November will be spent in Tyndale classes one day per week with concluding activities and events.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

An Offer of Admission to the BEd program will be determined by the Admissions Committee after a holistic review, as well as completing an admission interview. Meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to the program.

Eligibility for an Admission Interview

Eligibility for an admission interview will be based on the following:

- A three-year (90 credit hours, 15 full credit) baccalaureate degree from an officially recognized degree-granting institution with university status.
- Preference will be given to applicants who have completed or who are completing a 4-year baccalaureate degree (120 credit hours, 20 full credits), or who have completed both a 3-year baccalaureate degree plus the equivalent of 30 credit hours at another officially recognized post-secondary institution (i.e. an Ontario College of Applied Arts and Technology).
- A Grade Point Average (GPA) in the "B" range (minimum 70% or 2.7 on a 4.0 scale) or better, calculated on the applicant's best 60 credit hours of undergraduate university courses. College diploma and/or certificate courses, whether transferred into the university degree program or not, will not be included in the GPA calculation. For those completing an undergraduate degree during the application process, only courses completed by the application deadline will be assessed. A conditional acceptance, pending receipt of your final, official transcript, may be offered.
- Proficiency in English.
- Submission of the BEd application, application fees, and all requested documentation, including, but not limited to, all official post-secondary transcripts, written statements, and résumé (curriculum vitae).

Academic Equivalence

Applicants who do not meet the above GPA requirement may be selected for an admission interview if the Admissions Committee grants academic equivalence.

Academic equivalence can be demonstrated by either of the following:

- Substantial relevant experience in an education-related field (e.g. experience and/or employment as an Educational Assistant or Early Childhood Educator, employment as an uncertified/supply teacher, or private school/Montessori teacher).
- Demonstrated proficiency in an identified area of need in the publicly-funded school systems in Ontario (e.g., French language proficiency).

ADDITIONAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Primary/Junior Program Applicants

Primary/Junior applicants who wish to focus on teaching French as a Second Language must first pass the French Language Proficiency Test.

Junior/Intermediate Program Applicants

- Applicants to the Junior/Intermediate program must have completed or be currently completing a minimum of 12 credit hours (2 full credits), at the university level, in one of the following disciplines (teachable areas): English, French, Geography, History, Mathematics, Music (Instrumental), Science-General.
- Junior/Intermediate applicants who wish to register for the French as a Second Language teachable course must have successfully completed a minimum of 12 credit hours (2 full credits) in French at the university level, and have passed the French Language Proficiency Test.

Through a range of courses, students will explore the educational, developmental, and curricular aspects of discipleship, as well as qualitative research methods to evaluate and improve church-wide programs. Our aim is to foster kingdom communities that truly embody Christ's abundant life in and for the world.

CLINICAL COUNSELLING

There is a strong demand for mental health-related services as individuals become more aware of the importance of managing such conditions as anxiety and depression. Being well from within takes time, and helping someone find their way and achieve their goals is why many individuals choose to study counselling. This program is suitable for individuals who enjoy listening to others, are able to form connections and can provide support and resources.

The Master of Arts (MA) in Clinical Counselling program at Tyndale provides educational preparation for students to become certified counsellors with professional counselling associations and registered psychotherapists with the College of Registered Psychotherapists of Ontario (CRPO) certification. It prepares students as psychotherapists, equipping them to serve in a variety of agencies in secular or Christian settings or in private practice.

HISTORICAL AND THEOLOGICAL STUDIES

If you are seeking to deepen your knowledge and expertise in history and theology, then the MA in Historical and Theological Studies is tailor-made for you. By enrolling in this program, you will embark on an enriching journey of personal and academic growth. Whether you choose to pursue a thesis or a major research paper, you will acquire advanced research and writing skills, delve into specialized areas of interest, and develop a keen understanding of the methodological aspects that shape these disciplines. These invaluable experiences will not only enhance your scholarly capabilities but also pave the way for potential admission into a PhD program.

One of the remarkable aspects of this program is its focus on the Canadian context, coupled with a global and intercultural approach to history and theology.

MARKETPLACE THEOLOGY: CHINESE LANGUAGE (CCSTT)

Tyndale University and the Canadian Chinese School of Theology Toronto (CCSTT) have collaborated to offer a Master of Arts (MA) in Marketplace Theology in the Chinese language. THANATOLOGY

You will learn to adapt your skills to a secular or church environment as you support individuals and families confronting end-of-life, bereavement and other issues related to death, grief and loss.

Courses in the program focus on the grieving process; ethical issues surrounding death and dying; cultural, gender, and societal attitudes toward death; and the place of ritual and memorialization.

The Master of Arts (MA) in Thanatology at Tyndale will train you to respond compassionately to the needs of the dying and the bereaved. Tyndale is the only seminary to currently offer this specialized program. Graduates from the MA Thanatology program will leave the program with the confidence to support others in their time of need.

DEGREE & DIPLOMA OPTIONS

Graduate Diploma is a one-year program that provides you with a foundation of biblical, theological and ministry studies for your spiritual growth and ministry development. The Graduate Diploma allows you to tailor your studies to meet your learning and ministry needs.

9 courses | 1 year

Master of Theological Studies (MTS) is a two-year graduate degree that helps you understand the biblical, theological and historical foundations of the Christian faith. The MTS is a flexible program that can be tailored to meet your learning and ministry interests, or help you prepare for further studies.

18 courses | 2 years

Master of Divinity (MDiv) is a three-year professional ministry degree that provides you with knowledge and skills to be an effective and holistic ministry leader. The MDiv blends academic study, mentored learning and practical experience in a comprehensive program that will prepare you for ordained ministry or for Christian leadership in its various forms.

27 courses | 3 years

Post-Graduate Diploma will prepare you for professional certification. The Post-Graduate Diploma in Spiritual Direction provides educational requirements for the Certified Spiritual Director (CSD) designation. The Post-Graduate Diploma in Pastoral Thanatology provides educational requirements for the Certified Thanatologist Pastoral Specialist (CTPS) designation.

8 courses | 1.5 - 2 years

Master of Theology (ThM) is an advanced academic degree that provides you with an opportunity for in-depth study at an advanced level. Take this program if you have completed your MDiv or MTS and wish to enhance your ministerial and missional practice with additional scholarship or want to prepare for further study at the doctoral level.

6 courses + thesis | 1 year

Doctor of Ministry (DMin) is an advanced professional degree designed to enhance your spiritual, intellectual and professional abilities in Christian ministry. You will learn how to combine academic research, spiritual formation and applied ministry strategies in this 3-year, in-ministry program. Join a collaborative, peer-to-peer learning environment. You will experience personal, professional and spiritual growth leading to a greater effectiveness in ministry.

6 intensive modules + a major project | 3 years

Post-Doctor of Ministry Certificate is designed for students who already have a Doctor of Ministry degree, but are interested in taking additional courses as continued education. The Post-DMin Certificate is available in multiple areas of focus, such as: Communicating the Gospel, Leadership, Non-Profit Organizational Leadership, and Reframing Church in Context.

3 courses | 3 years

Concentrations: MDiv, MTS, MA and Graduate Diploma students may use their elective courses to complete a four-course concentration in a variety of areas of study.

Program durations are based on a traditional, full-time course load of nine courses per year.



STUDY OPTIONS

Tyndale provides a wide range of study options to meet your unique learning style and personal goals. Be prepared to lead and live from the core of your faith as you develop a comprehensive theological foundation.

Full-Time: Take the time to immerse yourself in your program. This includes taking three to five courses per term.

Part-Time: Individuals who cannot commit to full-time study can choose to study part-time. Tyndale does not require a minimum course load. Feel free to take as many or as few courses per semester as your life allows.

Night Classes: Tyndale offers a selection of night classes per semester. These classes often run once a week for the semester.

Online Courses: These courses are specifically designed so that students do not have to step foot on campus. Learning synchronously online makes it possible to learn from Tyndale's excellent faculty and experience a classroom environment with individuals who may be located around the world, in real-time.

Options are also available to learn on your own schedule, asynchronously, with little to no need for being online at a specific time. Courses are highly interactive with weekly topical question and answer sections where all students in the class and the professor debate and explore topical issues. These courses are designed to develop a learning, supportive community online.

One-Week Intensives: Tyndale offers one-week intensive classes, running Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., through two programs throughout the year. The first of these is Intersession, which runs in the first week of January; the second runs from May to August at various points.

Non-Traditional Class Schedules: Tyndale often has opportunities for classes with world-renowned and expert faculty who teach in a non-traditional format. Not only are these classes taught at times that are accessible for the non-traditional student, but the course content for these classes often covers material not generally found within a traditional seminary course.

Interactive Livestream: Connect via the web to a class that is taking place on the Tyndale campus to hear lectures and participate in real-time.

Chinese Theological Education – CCSTT: Tyndale University and the Association of Canadian Chinese Theological Education (ACCTE) have collaborated in a strategic partnership to organize the Canadian Chinese School of Theology Toronto (CCSTT). In this program, taught primarily in Mandarin, receive training to serve locally or internationally. Library and reference materials will be offered in English and Mandarin so that students are well-versed in both languages. Community life, small group, and chapel are designed to foster personal, interpersonal, spiritual and ministerial development.

Christian Education and Discipleship: Develop your understanding of curriculum, teaching, human development and discipleship foundations, so that you can teach and mentor people through different life and faith stages. Enhance your gifting as a leader and pastor for children and youth ministries and adult discipleship.

Christian History: This concentration will develop your capacity for careful analysis and critical thinking through the study of Christian history. The concentration's courses offer insights into the history of Christian mission, theology and spirituality. It will also help students in this age understand – and derive wisdom from – Christianity's historical engagements with culture, society and politics, both locally and globally.

Counselling & Psychotherapy Programs: Study towards becoming a certified counsellor in secular and Christian social service agencies, private practices, chaplaincy settings, or in congregational church environments. Through your studies and practical training in skills labs, learn how to counsel clients on issues such as: interpersonal conflict, couple and family therapy, depression, abuse, at-risk youth, suicidal ideation, and grief.

Global Christianity and Mission: Dive into the theology of mission and learn the skills needed to bring the hope of Christ to diverse situations anywhere in the world. As you study in the cultural mosaic of Toronto, you will prepare to live out your calling and actively respond to the needs of communities overseas, or even in your local neighbourhood.

Historical and Theological Studies: One of the remarkable aspects of this program is its focus on the Canadian context, coupled with a global and intercultural approach to history and theology. As you engage with a diverse community, which spans various denominations and draws from the Protestant evangelical heritage, you will be exposed to a wealth of perspectives.

Indigenous Studies: Indigenous academic leaders have designed and tailored this program for Indigenous people and those serving in its communities. Gain a multidisciplinary understanding of Indigenous theology, history and praxis. More than 80% of professors in the program are Native North Americans with doctoral degrees from a wide range of universities and seminaries. Learn from professors who are engaged in their own Indigenous communities and are committed followers of Jesus.

Interdisciplinary: As culture moves and shifts, there is an ever-growing need to adapt ministry contexts to meet people where they are. This major allows flexible course selection to meet your unique learning and ministry goals as you prepare to serve faithfully and effectively in all the ways you are called.

Pastoral Ministry: Be trained for church leadership in today's world through academic and applied courses. Faculty teach biblical principles, concepts and models for the preparation of ordained or lay ministry. You will develop lifelong relationships with others in a diverse cultural and denominational setting. You will also participate in a year-long church internship program for hands-on ministry experience in handling day-to-day problems in church ministries.

Pastoral Thanatology: Walk alongside people in their time of grief. You will explore the grieving process, be equipped with spiritual and biblical resources, discuss ethics and end-of-life issues, and study cultural, gender and social attitudes towards death. **Spiritual Formation:** Explore the field of Christian spirituality and learn how to apply the principles of spiritual formation in your own life and in your ministry. Draw from biblical and systematic theology, psychology, church history, sociology and philosophy to grow deeper with God. Study towards becoming a Certified Spiritual Director.

Pentecostal Studies: Be educated and equipped to specialize in Pentecostal Studies within the broader evangelical context of Tyndale. The program is a creative partnership between Master's Pentecostal Seminary and Tyndale, and offers an integrated program of cognitive, practical and spiritual formation for ministry.

Salvation Army Studies: This program is rooted in the Salvation Army's extensive history of meeting the needs of the most vulnerable in society. Scholars and practitioners from the Salvation Army tradition will guide your studies in this creative partnership between Booth University College and Tyndale. Gain a deep understanding of the Army within the broader church while you analyze social and moral issues and explore the global mission of the Army in today's world.

Through classes and an internship, learn how to develop and organize effective youth ministries.

PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMS

Chinese Theological Education – CCSTT: Tyndale University and the Association of Canadian Chinese Theological Education (ACCTE) have collaborated in a strategic partnership to organize the Canadian Chinese School of Theology Toronto (CCSTT). In this program, taught primarily in Mandarin, receive training to serve locally or internationally. Library and reference materials will be offered in English and Mandarin so that students are well-versed in both languages. Community life, small group, and chapel are designed to foster personal, interpersonal, spiritual and ministerial development.

Christian and Missionary Alliance Studies: In partnership with the Eastern Canadian District of the Christian and Missionary Alliance, this program will prepare graduates to become licensed to serve in Christian and Missionary Alliance churches throughout Canada and the world. Courses include Alliance History and Thought, Alliance Spirituality, Alliance Missions, and Developing Intercultural Competence.

Indigenous Studies: Gain a multidisciplinary understanding of Indigenous theology, history and praxis taught by Indigenous scholars and practitioners. Encourage others to fully embrace being an Indigenous follower of Jesus Christ. This concentration is offered in collaboration with NAIITS, an Indigenous learning community.

Pentecostal Studies: The purpose of the Pentecostal Studies program is to educate and equip students who wish to specialize in Pentecostal Studies within the broader evangelical context of Tyndale. The program is a creative partnership between Master's Pentecostal Seminary and Tyndale and offers an integrated program of cognitive, practical and spiritual formation for ministry.

MASTER OF THEOLOGY

The Master of Theology (ThM) is an advanced academic degree that provides an opportunity for in-depth study at an advanced level. Students completing the ThM will be prepared for further studies at the doctoral level and/or for the scholarly enhancement of their ministerial and missional practice.

With the option of a thesis and a non-thesis route, you can tailor your education experience to best fit your academic or ministry goals. The thesis option specifically prepares you for further studies at the doctoral level (ThD/PhD), whereas the non-thesis option is geared towards working in ministry and teaching in the church setting.

FURTHER DEPTH OF STUDY

The ThM focuses on three pillars of studies: Biblical studies, theological studies, and Christian history. The program is designed to help you develop research methodology skills in a community of faith. You may also choose to focus in the area of spiritual theology to complete the educational requirements for designation as a Certified Spiritual Director.

MENTORSHIP

Throughout the program, you will be mentored by your professors. You will take courses such as: Protestant Spiritual Traditions, The Theology of the Human Person, and Prayer and the People of God. Your professors will provide you with training and support for your future.

GRADUATE DIPLOMA

The one-year Graduate Diploma in Christian Studies provides students with a foundation of biblical, theological and ministry studies for their spiritual growth and ministry development. The Graduate Diploma allows students to tailor their studies to meet their learning and ministry needs.

Students may also choose to complete a four-course concentration in study areas such as

- Biblical Languages
- Biblical Studies
- Christian Studies, Chinese Language - CCSTT
- Christian and Missionary Alliance Studies
- Christian Education and Discipleship
- Christian History

All successfully-completed coursework can be transferred to the MDiv and MTS programs.

POST-GRADUATE DIPLOMAS

Tyndale offers two Post-Graduate Diplomas leading to professional certification.

Post-Graduate Diploma in Spiritual Formation: This program provides educational requirements for the Certified Spiritual Director (CSD) designation. The admission requirement for this post-graduate diploma is a Master's degree from an accredited theological school and an interview with a program coordinator or designate.

Post-Graduate Diploma in Pastoral Thanatology: This program provides educational requirements for the Certified Thanatologist Pastoral Specialist (CTPS) designation. The Admission requirement for this post-graduate diploma is a Master's degree from an accredited theological school and an interview with a program coordinator or designate.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Tyndale welcomes applicants with a Christian commitment who desire to further their studies and gain academic, professional and ministerial expertise within a vibrant community of faith and learning.

Here's what you need to know to be admitted at Tyndale Seminary:

Canadian Students

- Complete the online application form and any required program supplements
- Submit necessary references
- Meet Tyndale's English language requirements
- Have a completed baccalaureate degree from an accredited university or college with necessary degree and GPA requirements

International Students

- Complete the online application form (including a \$150 CAD non-refundable application fee) and any required program supplements
- Submit two references
- Meet Tyndale's English language requirements
- Have a completed baccalaureate degree from an accredited university or college with necessary degree and GPA requirements
- Provide proof of a Study Permit from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) prior to registration

Students from outside North America must submit a completed WES evaluation.

Visiting Students

A visiting student can enroll in a limited number of courses at Tyndale. Visiting students include: occasional students, post-graduate certification students, letter of permission students, and audit students. Requirements include, but are not limited to:

- Be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant (international students may take online courses from their home country)
- Have an undergraduate degree
- Meet Tyndale's English language requirements

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Applicants whose first language is not English, or who have not studied for three years in an English speaking secondary or post-secondary institution (where English is the language of instruction and examinations are in English) must submit proof of English language proficiency by supplying their scores/ results of either the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) or the Duolingo English Test.

Applicants who are not residents of Canada at the time of application must arrange to take the TOEFL/TWE or IELTS in the country from which they are applying. Tyndale's TOEFL institution code is 0532.





Paul Allen (BTh 1977; MDiv 1996) has helped people of all ages discover the good news of Jesus Christ.

Following 19 years of service as a pastor with two different churches in Toronto, Paul became the Ontario team leader of Hockey Ministries International (HMI), introducing the gospel to isolated, elite and influential junior and pro players. During his tenure, the HMI chapel presence grew from two to over 50 in the province, serving the NHL, AHL, OHL, OUA, and OHA.

Paul stepped down as team leader in 2021 but remains active in ministry. He continues to preach on Sundays; volunteers as a mentor to HMI chaplains, staff and preachers; and regularly meets with business and church leaders to help them grow as followers of Christ.

Arleen Xiomara Gomez (2015 MDiv) was interested in studying at Tyndale because it offered a master's degree that combined her two passions: theology and psychotherapy.

"My education at Tyndale helped form my clinical skills and understand people in a more holistic way," she says. "The class on trauma I took in my last year was absolutely foundational to me in understanding mental health and the people I work with now."

Arleen works as a care manager and associate pastor at Yonge Street Mission (YSM) in Toronto, Ontario. YSM provides support and services to individuals, families, children, youth and entire communities living with chronic poverty.

"It is the joy of my life to see people come to know Jesus Christ, give their lives to Him, get baptized and grow in their spiritual gifts."

DOCTOR OF MINISTRY



The vibrancy of the church in Canada and the world depends on effective leaders in all areas of ministry. If you have completed an MDiv or equivalent, and are engaged in ministry and wish to further develop your personal and ministry competencies, Tyndale's Doctor of Ministry (DMin) program will improve your capacity and depth in your God-given vocation.

You will combine academic research, spiritual formation and applied ministry strategies in this three-year, in-ministry program. Students can expect to:

- Join a collaborative and supportive peer-to-peer learning environment
- Advance their understanding of the nature, purposes, and practice of ministry
- Enhance their leadership and formational competencies in discernment, theological reflection, and in-ministry research
- Gain opportunities for personal and spiritual growth
- Learn to navigate the complexities of life and ministry in the contemporary church

AREAS OF FOCUS

DMin in Clinical Counselling and Psychotherapy addresses the growing need for skilled and competent mental health care, both in the church and in the marketplace. This program is designed for registered psychotherapists (or those in related professions) seeking to deepen their clinical expertise and further their professional training. Students will be equipped with advanced competencies, research opportunities and skills to expand their leadership platform, and bolster their practice.

DMin in Leadership track focuses on improving leadership capacity to understand systems, manage change, and develop as an organization. It combines theory with practice, theology with ministry, and collaborative learning with individual projects.

DMin in Leadership with a Concentration in Communicating the Gospel provides theological and practical support to ministry leaders in communicating the gospel in all contexts where people of faith are living. This includes congregational settings, digital ministries, overseas mission fields, children and youth ministries, music ministries, and para-church ministries. This concentration will explore the continued cultural and contextual relevance of the biblical text being proclaimed in creative, innovative, and effective ways. It will also support leaders to develop greater proficiency in preaching, storytelling, and evangelism.

DMin in Leadership with a Concentration in Non-Profit Organizational Leadership focuses on Organizational Leadership specifically for non-profit Christian organizations from multiple sectors (international development, missions, denominational, para-church etc.) Students will learn principles of effective organizational and foundational theories of leadership, explore relevant research findings and cultural/sociological/psychological dynamics, and develop awareness of alternative models for understanding and leading individuals and teams in business and professional organizations.

DMin in Leadership with a Concentration in Reframing Church in Context explores the nature, history, mission and practices of the church as it interacts with a student's diverse contextual experiences and callings. To investigate and develop this relationship, the program will address the strategic priority of hospitality and service as theological concepts central to the mission of the triune God. It will also encourage ministry leaders to experiment with ministry application as they put their knowledge into practice with the support of experienced, reflective practitioners.

DMin in Leadership with a Concentration in Reframing Church in Context (Korean Canadian Context cohort) will address issues specific to the Korean Canadian church. Participants can expect to work on some projects collaboratively rather than as individuals.

DMin in Pastoral Thanatology tracks seeks to integrate the spiritual development of the student with their knowledge and skill in helping those who have experienced loss in various forms. Pastoral Thanatology explores the biblical and spiritual resources available in grief and bereavement and provides knowledge and skills for those facing or coping with grief and death from the perspective of both the dying and the bereaved.

DMin in Spiritual Formation focuses on experiencing personal spiritual growth, understanding the dynamics of spirituality, and facilitating the spiritual formation of others. This track is ideal for anyone involved in formational ministry (e.g. spiritual direction, pastoring, Christian education, youth ministry). It applies insights from theology, psychology, sociology, education and spirituality to a variety of formational ministries. This track satisfies the academic course requirements for becoming a Certified Spiritual Director.

POST-DOCTOR OF MINISTRY CERTIFICATE

Students who already have a Doctor of Ministry (DMin) degree can complete a Post-DMin Certificate in multiple areas of focus. The Post-DMin Certificate is designed for people who already have a DMin but want to take additional courses as continued education. Students will complete three concentration courses within three years. These courses can be taken in-person or online.

Lisa’s focus was on the 1.5 and second-generation Korean Canadian women leaders in the Korean diaspora church context.

As a young Korean Canadian woman in leadership, Lisa drew inspiration from literature, her professors and her cohort at Tyndale.

“Our cohort was pretty diverse, coming from different traditions and cultural backgrounds, and the conversations we’ve had have been very rich. It was fun to see how we could still work together and have fun.... We definitely bonded.”

Lisa served as valedictorian for her graduating class and works as the Global Strategist for “Finishing the Task,” a mission network under the direction of Pastor Rick Warren.

“Starting from the very first week of the DMin program, we had these moments in class where people started sharing more of their lives and their spiritual journeys, and it became apparent that God had pulled us together. There are faculty members I interacted with, who were absolute geniuses, who were also loving, kind, gentle, thoughtful people, who took their own spiritual formation seriously. I grew so much.

I formed friendships with people from all over the world in my cohort, and it was refreshing to hear different approaches and vantage points. As someone from the States, I feel like Tyndale is a treasure that’s just right across the border.” – **J.L. Miller (DMin 2020)**



ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Academic Prerequisite

Qualified applicants must have a Master of Divinity or equivalent for the DMin degree. Qualified applicants must have a DMin degree for the post-DMin certificate.

Basic Competencies

Candidates must have basic computer skills that include the ability to access information, communicate by email and write effectively. Applicants whose first language is not English need to submit proof of academic English proficiency.

Ministry Engagement

The DMin and post-DMin programs integrate classwork with research. You will plan and execute a project in your own ministry context. Applicants will have at least three years of ministry experience and be engaged in a substantive, recognized ministry with scope for initiative and professional development. Students are expected to maintain engagement in ministry throughout the program.

Time Commitment

Tyndale's DMin is designed to be completed while continuing ministry. It includes nine weeks of residency to be completed in approximately four years. The residencies are in one or two week blocks in the same time frame each year. Candidates should plan to spend at least one day a week on DMin assignments in addition to the residencies and their project work. The Post-DMin Certificate is designed for people who already have a DMin but who want to take additional courses as continued education. Students will complete three concentration courses within three years.

Application Deadlines

The Admissions Committee meets to consider completed applications (all documents received and interview concluded) once each season. The admission deadline for all tracks is January 15. All supplemental documents must be submitted by January. Admitted students start pre-residency work in February/March.



Tyndale is an independent, not-for-profit, trans-denominational institution that reviews its fee structure each year. Its independent status means that it does not receive denominational support and government funding. The cost of education is therefore subsidized by other income, including substantial donations from the Christian community.

Tyndale has undergone a number of iterations and name changes over the course of its more than 125 years of history. Its humble beginnings originated in 1894 as a Bible Training School in the Toronto area with 138 students from eight different denominations. Today, over 90 denominations and more than 60 ethnic backgrounds are represented among the student body in one of the most diverse cities in the world. As Tyndale grew, so did the vision to seek appropriate accreditation enabling students to carry out their God-inspired purpose. Tyndale is dedicated to the pursuit of truth, to excellence in teaching, learning and research, for the enriching of mind, heart and character, to serve the church and the world for the glory of God.

Tyndale has been approved by the Government of Canada as a Designated Learning Institution, making it possible for the school to accept international students with study permits.

Tyndale's undergraduate education, rooted in the humanities, arts and sciences, seeks to deepen knowledge, cultivate wisdom and develop character to serve Christ and the world. In 2003, as the result of a vigorous and thorough review by the Post-secondary Education Assessment Board (PEQAB), and their recommendation to the Ministry of Colleges & Universities that Tyndale has the ability to meet or exceed the requirements of delivering undergraduate and seminary/graduate programs, Tyndale was granted authority to offer a Bachelor of Arts degree. More recently, following another robust review by PEQAB and their recommendation to the Ministry, in December 2020, Tyndale's name was legally changed to Tyndale University by an act of legislation. The charter extended to embed the Bachelor of Education degree and offer new degrees including the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA), the BBA with honours, and the Master of Arts degree.

As a recognized degree-granting institution, Tyndale grants Bachelor of Arts degrees, including Honours degrees in the arts, business administration and social sciences, under authority granted by the Legislative Assembly of Ontario.

Tyndale received initial consent from the Ontario Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities in 2007 and initial accreditation from the Ontario College of Teachers to offer a Bachelor of Education (BEd) program to prepare teachers for employment in primary, junior and intermediate divisions in 2008. Since then, Tyndale's BEd program has been accountable to the regular review processes required by each regulatory body. Graduates of Tyndale's BEd program are eligible for a Certificate of Qualification from the Ontario College of Teachers. The program has gained significant reputation, and teacher candidates are actively sought after. Offering a distinctive 16-month experience, teacher candidates are prepared for serving in the field of education through a collaborative community that includes seasoned professors and faculty advisors.

Tyndale Seminary was established in 1976 and has grown to become Canada's largest seminary, offering a unique and wide-ranging educational experience. The Seminary is accredited by The Commission on Accrediting of The Association of Theological Schools (located at 10 Summit Park Drive, Pittsburgh, PA 15275, USA, www.ats.edu). Degree programs include Master of Arts (MA), Master of Divinity (MDiv), Master of Theological Studies (MTS), Master of Theology (ThM) and Doctor of Ministry (DMin). In compliance with accreditation standards, Tyndale Seminary engages in ongoing assessments of its educational effectiveness.

The MA and MDiv in Clinical Counselling programs are acknowledged by the College of Registered Psychotherapists of Ontario (CRPO) as recognized education and training programs for psychotherapists.
