



## House Leader (HL)

### **Position Summary:**

The House Leader (HL) is a member of the Tyndale University Undergraduate Student Association (TUUSA) Council. As a student leader they are responsible to promote the vision and mission of the Council, represent students, strive for excellence in their academics, and to model the standards set in the Tyndale Student Handbook.

The HL's primary responsibility is to provide leadership, community development, and spiritual formation opportunities for their designated House (Adrian, Boehmer, Harris, McRae, and Stiller). They are also responsible for actively seeking out the concerns and ideas of the students within their House and bringing them to the Student Leadership Team for discussion.

The House Leader is responsible to the student body, the TUUSA Council, the Coordinator of Spiritual Development and the Community Life Specialist.

### **Student Leadership Responsibilities:**

- Highly encouraged to attend Spring, Fall, and Winter Inspire Days and retreats
- Attend Fall student leadership training sessions
- Attend monthly student leadership meetings
- Assist with facilitating different activities during Orientation Week and the U Getaway
- Attend chapels and community gatherings on a regular basis

### **Appointment Responsibilities:**

- Attend weekly House Leadership meetings
- Provide overall leadership to the House
  - Offer support and vision to the House
  - Journey with and support first year students through their first year of studies
  - Offer support (devotional, emotional, academic (as appropriate), and relational) to members of the House.
- Lead regular social activities and interactions with the House
  - Facilitate weekly House lunches on Thursdays
  - Promote and help facilitate House Challenges (2-3 a semester)
  - Meet regularly with your House and Community Event Organizer (EO) partner to plan events throughout the academic year
    - The Event Organizer will coordinate, plan, and execute at least one House event for your House per semester with your support

- Assist the EO with setup, clean up, and execution of House events
- Lead INDS House Small groups on Thursday mornings as directed by the Dean of Student Life
  - It is required to be available to lead your INDS group on Thursdays
- Provide weekly communication to your House via email and other forms of communication to update members on weekly activities, House points, House challenges, and House keys
- This service opportunity will demand a minimum of 6 hours a week each semester.

### **Qualifications**

- A cumulative GPA of 2.30 and current GPA of 2.00. If the student's cumulative GPA is less than 2.3 then the student must have a current GPA of 2.7
- Good financial standing with Tyndale
- Good standing with chapel attendance
- Able to return to campus before fall and winter semesters start for training and/or retreats
- Able to take initiative and think creatively
- Be a good role model for students
- Commitment to Tyndale's mission and vision
- Desire for personal growth and leadership development
- Organization is beneficial and small group leadership is beneficial
- Professing Christian with demonstrated spiritual maturity
- Uphold and adhere to the statements, standards, and guidelines set out in the Student Handbook
- Conflict resolution skills are beneficial
- Leadership experience is beneficial
